What's Happening?

What: West Northants Council, working with Kier Transportation will be carrying out carriageway resurfacing works. This work will include new asphalt surfacing, installing new anti-skid, road markings and civils.

Where: The works will take place along the A422 from Farthinghoe to Middleton Cheney

When: 14th - 19th July
21st - 26th July
7th - 11th July
28th - 1st August
4th - 8th August

Working hours: 14th - 19th July 9:30-15:30
21st - 26th July - 20:00-6:00
7th - 11th July - 20:00-6:00
28th - 1st August - 20:00-6:00
4th - 8th August - 20:00-6:00

Traffic Management:

14th -19th July – 24/7 – 2 Way lights.

Remaining Dates -

A road closure will be in place along with an approved diversion route.

Residents / Businesses: Access for residents/businesses within the closure will be maintained where possible. However, prolonged delays are to be expected. There will be no access through the closure for any businesses/residents outside the closure extents.

Emergency Vehicles: We aim to maintain access for emergency vehicles when safe to do so.

Pedestrians and Cyclists: Cyclists will be asked to follow the traffic management diversion route.

Public Transport: Bus stops will be suspended during the works. Bus services will be notified of the works and will make alternative arrangements. Please contact your local bus provider for further information.

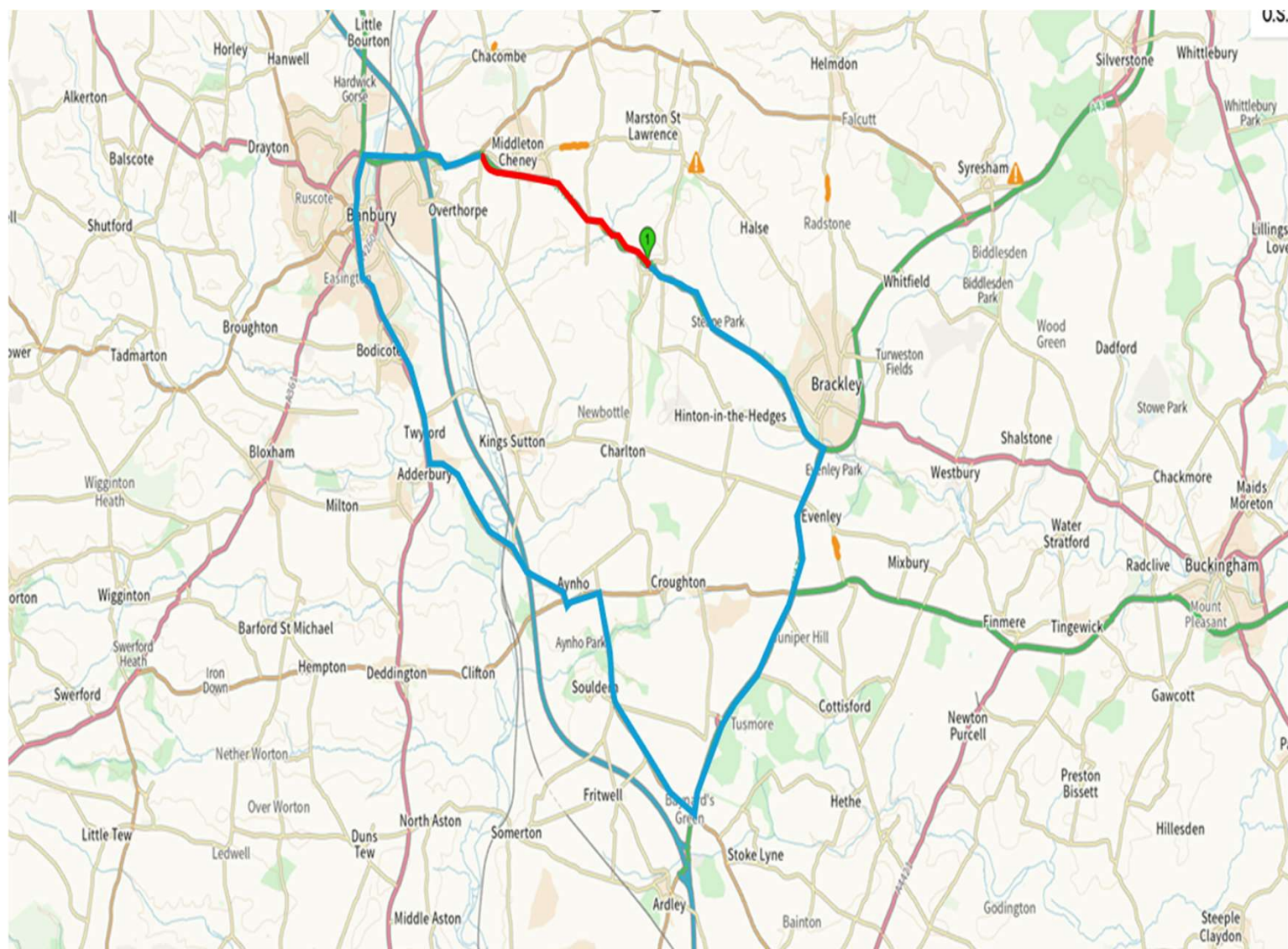
